82 participants secured employment

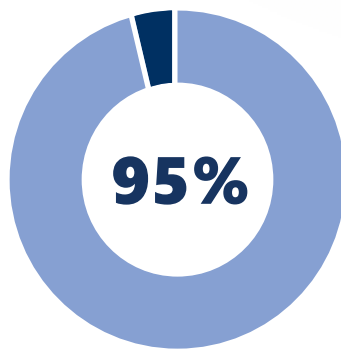


431,307 pounds of food prepared in Central Kitchen (LMM's social enterprise)

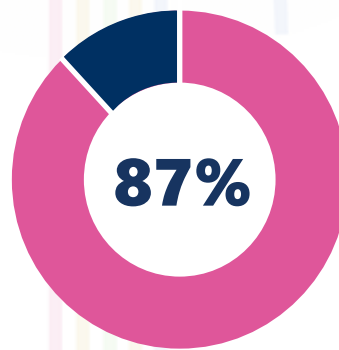

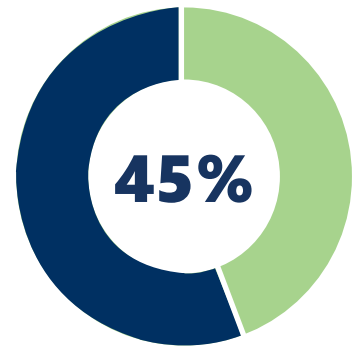
